Some Safety Issues to Consider

- Accidental deployment of the airbag system could happen if you inadvertently probe the wrong wire. Most manufacturers use yellow-colored wiring to denote wiring for the airbag system. Always be aware of the system/circuit you are working on.
- **Caution:** Most types of brake fluid are harmful to painted surfaces. Be sure to prevent brake fluid from coming into contact with a vehicle's paint. Use fender covers to minimize this risk and be sure to wipe up any spilled brake fluid immediately with a wet rag.
- Comply with personal and environmental safety practices associated with clothing; eye protection; hand tools; power equipment; proper ventilation; and the handling, storage, and disposal of chemicals/materials in accordance with local, state, and federal safety and environmental regulations.

Performance Standard
