


## How do I add a YouTube video to my course


This document provides step-by-step guidance showing you how to add and embed a YouTube video as part of your course content.

1. Hover your mouse pointer over the topic to which you'd like to add a video and click on the **Add an activity or resource** option that displays in the bottom right of the topic. Please note, course editing must be turned on




2. This display a popup window providing options for types of activities or resources you may build in the course. Under the **Resources** section displayed in this window, select the radio dial for the **Page** option and then click **Add**

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
3. On the resulting page, add a name and description for the video in the designated text fields. Both fields are required. The description will only be visible to students if the **Display description on course page** box is also checked.

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4. In the **Page content** field, click the first **Show more buttons** button from the options along the top to open an additional row of buttons underneath. From this new row of buttons, click the **HTML** button.




5. After clicking the HTML button, paste the **embed code** for the video you'd like to display into the **Page content** field. (YouTube and other popular video sharing sites have a **Share** option for each video which will provide you with the embed code required. You must copy this specific code from the video sharing page and paste it into the **Page content** field in Navigate 2.)



## How do I add a YouTube video to my course


- After clicking the HTML button and pasting the embed code required, scroll down and click the **Save and display** button at the bottom of the page.
