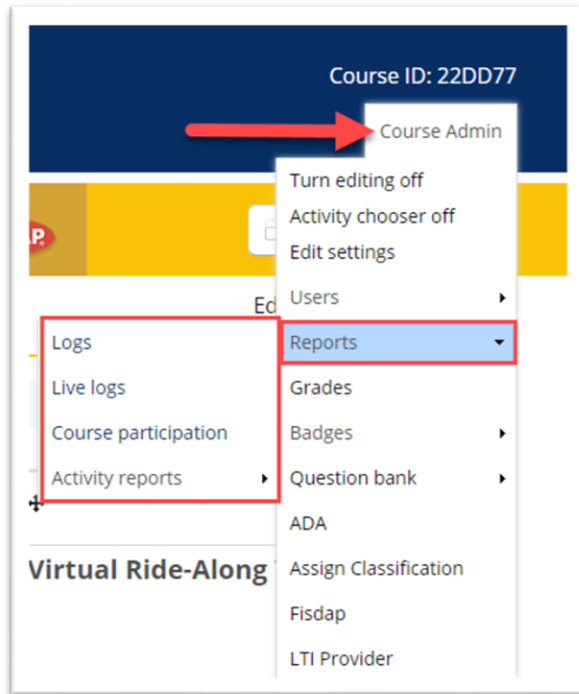


How do I track student course activity and participation

This document provides instructions on how to monitor general course activity within a Navigate 2 course.


1. From the **Lessons, Learning Tools, or Teaching Tools** tab, hover your mouse pointer over the **Course Admin** menu at the top right side of the screen. Then hover over **Reports** and select the desired option



2. Navigate 2 displays a list of four report types:
 - a. **Logs** track what students have done and when
 - b. **Live logs** track students' activities in the moment
 - c. **Activity report** lists all activities in the course, displays how many views an activity has had, lists any related blog entries and shows the date and time of the last access. You can click an activity to display its individual details
 - d. **Course participation** displays information about actions students have taken on individual Activities
3. You can also track student engagement which is specific to the course eBook. For instance, you can often draw a direct line from the amount of time a student spends reading and studying the material to that student's performance in class.
4. Click the **Reports & Grades** tab and then launch **eBook Analytics**
5. Navigate 2 displays information about eBook usage, including:
 - a. Class Performance by Chapter
 - b. Student eBook Overall Performance
 - c. Student eBook Engagement & Performance Correlation

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- Use the filter options at the top of the page to target the reported data and view high-level course eBook statistics in the stats bar provided.
